
The Story of a Mountain Midwife
"Aunt Orlene" - Orlene Hawks Puckett

Orlene Hawks Puckett served as a midwife from 1889 until 1938. She lived with her husband John in the mountains of Patrick County and together they had 24 children, none who lived more than a few days. The Puckett Cabin sits along the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 190. "Aunt Orlene", as she was known, is said to have helped birth over 1000 babies. In 2012 Orlene Hawks Puckett was posthumously honored as one of the Library of Virginia's "Virginia Women in History". Our speaker Phyllis Stump, a retired English teacher, spent many years researching the life of "Aunt Orlene". She is author of the book "Called: The Story of a Mountain Midwife", and has done numerous programs on "Aunt Orlene".

This is the time of year we reflect on our Floyd County Historical Society's past year and share plans for the future. What does the Historical Society do to be visible, active and informative, besides operate the Museum? We are happy to summarize some of our activities, projects and future plans.

Our special exhibits for 2016 are "Educational Opportunities for All: The Growth of Floyd County Schools", Tribute to Mamie Phillips Vest and Celebrating 75th Anniversary of the Radford Arsenal.

Presented programs at bi-monthly meetings: Lynn Reed- Montgomery White Sulfur Springs Confederate Cemetery, Sandra Warren- World War II Bomber Crash, Dianne Cunningham- Harris Hart-School and Tribute to historian Jean Schaeffer, Visit to Double Springs one room School house, Dennis Kitts- Radford Arsenal and Floyd County, Phyllis Stump- Orlene Puckett and Midwifery.

Joined with Floyd County Tourism and redesigned 250 brochures to I-77 rest area for promoting Floyd.

Created signs, ads and calendar events to send to regional newspapers, TV and radio on regular basis to advertise our events and projects.

Kept the Museum open April through December, Thursday, Friday 12-4 and Saturday, 11 until 3 pm.

Participated with the New River Heritage Coalition, Virginia Association of Museums and Floyd Chamber of Commerce to promote the Society, Museum and Floyd.

Provided genealogy and cemetery help to visitors and callers along with directions and tourist help.

Created and printed 4 newsletters and many needed brochures.

Ann Shank updated and recorded OnCell Audio tour with each new exhibit. By calling 540-585-3070, listeners can hear information about the different components of the current exhibits.

Updated power point photo presentation for Jessie Peterman Library to use.

Supplied historical photographs to Floyd County Clerks office for display.

Supported Janet Keith in efforts to tour and relate history of Laurel Branch and Topeco Communities through bus tours and brochures.

Participated in Floyd Christmas parade with float featuring John Dennis Harman's restored buggy which was used by his father to deliver mail.

Archived photos, documents and historical items for future use.

Sold books, historical calendars, Floyd post cards, county prints.

Continue to plan and research for World War II book about Floyd's involvement.

Awarded \$650.00 in Art Scholarships to Floyd High School senior winners depicting Floyd's early schools through creative arts. Winning entries are on display at the Museum.

Researched and published 2017 Calendar "Historic Country Stores of Floyd County Vol. II"

Completed and erected Civil War Trails sign with information on Stoneman's Raid through Floyd

Sponsored essay writing contest for all 6th graders in Floyd's 4 elementary schools concerning early education in Floyd

Sponsored field trips to both Double Springs one room school house and the Museum for all 6th graders in the county after making classroom presentations in the various classrooms.

Added new volunteers, docents and memberships.

Approximately 1100 visitors have come to meetings or to the Museum from April 2015-October 2016

Continue to receive, document and store or exhibit archival materials.

Compiling photos for 2019 calendar to feature sepia images of Floyd County.

Continue to prepare driving tour brochures of Floyd Water Powered Mills and driving tour of Town of Floyd, with inclusion on Audio Tour.

Used a \$3,010.00 Grant from Larry Woodrow Vest Fund of Foundation For Roanoke Valley. This supported an educational exhibit, field trips to the Museum and Double Springs School and essay contest for all Floyd County 6th graders with monetary awards.

Entertained Museum tours for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, church groups, retired teachers and family reunions.

Provided an educational exhibit and bingo booth at Floyd Fair held at Chantilly Farms.

Plan to complete identification of the 1970's Ariel photo

Working with Floyd County on the Virginia World War I and World War II Commemoration Commission Committee to help celebrate our veterans and preserve our history.

Theme for 2017 special exhibit will be "Celebrating Floyd Sports"
