Living History Day At Phlegar House May 12, 2012

Floyd County Historical Society will be joining with Floyd County Historical Preservation Trust and Floyd County Civil War Sesquicentennial Committee to present "Living History Day at Phlegar House" on May 12 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.

The New River Rifles Reenactment Group will be on hand to portray the 24th VA Infantry and the 83rd PA.

We will have hot dogs, BBQ, chips and drinks available for sale.

There will be information available for you to research your Floyd Civil War ancestor. You can bring your photographs and documents from that era and have them scanned and digitally preserved for future generations to view.



Weavers will be on hand to show how to weave the old way. Booths will have information on various topics.

Local historians will be telling stories of the men from Floyd County who served in the Civil War. Floyd County was not involved in any major battles on the home front, but there were many men from Floyd who served on both sides and some perished during this time. General George Stoneman's men came through Floyd County in April 1865 and looted the area. This caused more hardships for the families that were already suffering from famine and fever. Stoneman's men camped at the Phlegar house so this is the perfect place for you to actually walk in history's footsteps.

The Phlegar house was built circa 1816 and was owned by the family until a few years ago when Floyd County Historical Preservation Trust took ownership. They are trying to restore this gem for future generations. Directions: turn off of Christiansburg Pike (route 615) onto Commerce Center Drive and follow the signs to Phlegar house.

Chapter 1 Places


