### **Civil War Living History Day at the Phlegar House**

Floyd County Historical Society along with Floyd County Historical Preservation Trust and the Floyd County Civil War Sesquicentennial Committee will present the 2nd Annual Civil War Living History Day at the Phlegar House in the Floyd Regional Commerce Center, off Christiansburg Pike (Route 615), on May 11, 2013 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.

The featured speaker will be historian Chris J. Hartley, author of <u>Stoneman's Raid, 1865</u>, who will speak about Stoneman's cavalry movements through Floyd County in April of 1865.

Re-enactors will portray both soldier life and life on the home front. Educational programs will be presented during the morning, and military demonstrations take place in the afternoon. Research materials will be available to look up Floyd County Civil War connections and ancestor information.

The military demonstrations in the afternoon will include a portrayal of General Stoneman's Union cavalry meeting up with the Floyd Confederate Home Guard.
